


The Sound of Birdsong (and Music!)

The nature diary of Mary Edith Morris

In December 2003 a nature diary compiled by Mary Edith Morris of Bryn Myrddin, Abergwili, covering the period 1936-1971 was deposited in the archive. Perhaps predictably, for those who know me, my interest was in the bird sightings recorded within the volume, and, in that respect, it is an uncommon resource for Carmarthenshire for the mid twentieth century. Ingram and Salmon highlight this in their 1954 list of birds

for Carmarthenshire, bemoaning the lack of available recorded data after the publication of Barker's 1905 *Handbook to the Natural History of Carmarthenshire.* But, as Edith Morris's journal illustrates, it is not necessarily a lack of recording, but possibly the lack of knowledge of, or access to, such material. It is not until the 1970s and 1980s that there is the start of any substantial amount of publicly available data on bird

recording within the county. This was provided by surveys organised by the British Trust for Ornithology² and annual reports for Carmarthenshire compiled by the West Wales Naturalists' Trust.

Mary Edith Morris was born at Bryn Myrddin, Abergwili, on 3 August 1887 and baptised in Abergwili church on 7 September the same year. Her Godfather was her uncle, John Ryle Morris, and she had two Godmothers, her aunt Julia Anne Vaughan and Mary Saunders.' She was the second child of the four children of Edward Harold Morris and his wife Edith (née Abadam of Middleton Hall). Her older brother David died of scarlet fever at the age of four, and her younger brother Ryle inherited Bryn Myrddin on their father's death. Ryle married Countess Alicemargit Hoyos in Vienna in 1931; both are mentioned in the diary. She also had a younger sister, Vida. Neither Mary nor Vida married.

The connection of her father with Thomas William Barker must have had an influence on her interest in natural history; he was a keen naturalist and antiquary and compiled the *Handbook to the Natural History of Carmarthenshire* in 1905. J. H. Barker, Thomas's father, had formed a business partnership with Edith's father, Edward Harold Morris, on 5 May 1879. Thomas Barker in 1886 joined his father in the firm of Barker & Morris, subsequently known as Barker, Morris & Barker. Both the Barkers died in the early part of the twentieth century, Thomas William on 7 July 1912 and his father eight years earlier on 19 December 1904. E. H. Morris carried on the business with the name unchanged and evidently the connection of the two families continued as on 11 November 1937' Alice Abadam writes to Mary's brother Ryle telling him that Mary was staying with the Barkers 'whom she likes so much'. She and the Miss Barkers went to see 'Grey Owls' nature films.

Mary was educated at home with the help of a French governess, and later went to boarding school at Malvern Ladies' College. She then worked for seven years at King's College Hospital in London. In about 1920 she became one of the pioneer policewomen and served for two years attached to the military police in

the British Army of Occupation in the Rhine Provinces of Germany, where she was stationed for a time at Cologne. She became fluent in German and amongst other duties there attended hearings in the German courts of justice, acted as an interpreter and carried out welfare work among women and girls. On her return to Britain she was attached to the Metropolitan Police force, working in the streets and parks and in the East End of London. She also served for some years in Sheffield, arriving there in 1925 when there was only one other policewoman in the city.

In 1936, when her nature diary starts, she was working in Beddington and living with her aunt Alice Abadam at 70 Hamilton Terrace, St John's Wood, London. Alice was a constitutional Suffragist and founder of the Feminist League, who gave lectures all over the country. She had a great influence on Mary. In 1939 Alice and Mary both moved down to Bryn Myrddin when war broke out. From the notes in the journal Mary seems to be dividing her time between London and Bryn Myrddin during 1938 and 1939 but it is not clear if Alice is with her. The last entry in the journal with a reference to London is 19 August 1939. Alice Abadam died at Bryn Myrddin in 1940, leaving her house in London to Mary, who sold it and remained at Bryn Myrddin, apart from occasional visits elsewhere, until 1955 when she bought Brynteg on the outskirts of Ffynonddrain, near Carmarthen.

Many of her wildlife sightings recorded in the diary when she was in London were on or near Beddington Sewage Farm, which is still a valuable site for bird sightings, now managed and monitored by the Beddington Farm Bird Group. Birds at Beddington were certainly being recorded when she was in London as the first known survey was in 1933. However, the outbreak of the second World War temporarily halted any further plans. After the war the London Natural History Society became involved and regular recording and bird ringing resumed at the sewage farm. There can be no doubt that if Mary Edith had still been in London she would have become involved.


As with all documents the primary interest is often supplemented by the secondary information discovered within. There are frequent mentions of place and field names, and of neighbours and people she spoke to in the local area, often recording their sightings in the diary. For example, on 9 May 1944 she records: 'Swifts arrived at Cothi Bridge, says Mrs Arthur Jones.' Birdsong is a regular feature of the entries, recording both

what we would still regard as common species and those which have since declined or disappeared from Carmarthenshire, species such as the woodlark and corncrake. A typical entry is that of 27 January 1957: 'Heard Thrush, missel thrush, great tit, hedge sparrow & robin. Saw snowdrops & 2 primroses.' Many of the day to day entries follow a similar pattern; of particular interest in these are the notes of when she first hears or sees spring migrants. These often have value in showing historical variations in arrival dates. On 17 May 1959 there was a world-wide co-ordinated 'Dawn and Dusk Chorus Study'. It was well advertised but, despite her interest in noting bird song, Mary does not seem to have participated, her only entry for that day being 'Heard Blackcaps singing at Brynteg.'10 Other entries in the diary have more detail, recording behaviour such as that on 29 January 1949: '... Bluetit in dining room on cord of Electric Light control & in & out after food all day.' Or that of 3 October 1951: 'I saw a Buzzard carrying off in its feet part of the nest of wasps out of bank in back lane which it had been digging out all the afternoon . . .' Undoubtedly a Honey Buzzard, a rare summer visiting species then, and one that still is now; the first confirmed record for Carmarthenshire had been only thirty years earlier near Llangadog.

There are many similar individual entries in the diary identifying particular habits or sightings worthy of reading, see the following full transcript of the diary. Since the time of writing the status of some of the birds regularly mentioned in the text has changed substantially. There are also a few who are noticeable by their absence. I have made a few notes below on some of these.

Red squirrel – So not a bird, but I have chosen this as it is surprising that there is only one entry – in 1945. At that time the red squirrel would have been common throughout the county, possibly even regarded as abundant in places. There was no noticeable contraction in its range until the 1950s. Why there were not more entries of sightings of red squirrels is a mystery. It is now restricted to a few small pockets in the north of the county, the only known red squirrels in south Wales.

Manx shearwater - There are fairly regular sightings along the coast of Carmarthenshire but inland sightings are very rare. On 15 September 1950 she reports finding one near the drive to Bryn Myrddin. It had

been blown inland by a gale the previous night. In September 2011 this was repeated with two birds being found in Carmarthen, one at Glangwili Hospital, the second in the car park outside the Archive Office. Needless to say I was on holiday at the time!

Heron – There is a heronry in Bryn Myrddin wood so I was surprised when reading the diary to find that it was not mentioned at all. However, as it seems to be known of first in 2003 it is not so surprising that she did not mention it. Occasionally heronries move but from the available data there do not seem to be any existing heronries that were abandoned around that time so presumably it was newly established in 2003 or thereabours.

Little egret – It is theoretically possible that a little egret could have been seen as they were occasionally in Wales in the 1960s, certainly in Pembrokeshire, but no known

sightings in Carmarthenshire until much later. Now they are relatively commonplace and breed regularly in the county, I am sure she would have been thrilled to see such an exotic and delightful bird.

Corncrake – In decline since the beginning of the twentieth century and regarded as a rare bird in south Wales by 1938, Mary records hearing them fairly regularly up until 1966. They were present in the Towy valley up until 1979 but since then as sporadic passage birds only.

Collared dove — Following its explosion across Europe the collared dove was first recorded in Carmarthenshire in 1965, and first known breeding in 1968. It was not common across the county but Carmarthen was one of the areas it was known to inhabit, but obviously Mary did not see one, or hear of one being seen. Now there can not be anyone who does not know the bird.

Blackcap – Mary mentions hearing and seeing blackcaps regularly, but none in winter. They were known to overwinter in small numbers in the county from the 1930s onwards. Now, despite being classified as a summer visitor, they are regularly seen in the winter. I get them in the garden every winter, invariably appearing in the last two weeks of November.

Woodlark – Regularly recorded by her up until the 1960s and present in the county and breeding until the 1970s but in rapid decline since, and now very rarely encountered.

Partridge – Recorded by Mary up until the 1940s which fits the known pattern. They were plentiful in the early part of the twentieth century but by the 1950s had declined dramatically. Now seen occasionally but by no means common.

Curlew – Regarded as a quite numerous breeding species in the 1950s, has declined steadily since and now breeds only sporadically and locally.

Cuckoo – Mention the cuckoo today and most people lament that they no longer hear them. It is a declining and no longer common species. Mary's records of cuckoos are an annual feature of the diary. After a while reading one anticipates the entries, as indeed she must have anticipated writing them. It is perhaps fitting that the last entry in the diary is hearing the cuckoo on Merlin's Hill.

She was very happy in Ffynonddrain, but eventually became unable to look after herself and moved back to Bryn Myrddin into one of the flats created there. The diary becomes gradually more exiguous after this time, and stops altogether in 1971. For the last couple of years of her life she lived in a home in Llandrindod Wells where she maintained her connection with wildlife, feeding a tame robin that used to come into the kitchen there. She died on 4 December 1975 and was interred in Abergwili churchyard after a Requiem Mass held in St Mary's Church, Carmarthen.

And the Sound of Music? No, not Julie Andrews singing over Merlin's Hill but a connection perhaps almost as bizarre involving torpedoes and a bottle of champagne. When researching for the article, my curiosity was piqued by Alicemargit's maiden name of Hoyos, triggering one of those 'I've seen that name before' moments. It was resolved when I (re)found the reminiscences of Count Edgar Hoyos, Alicemargit's father, deposited in the archive by Alicemargit (as Mrs Ryle Morris) in 1975." I had previously dismissed it as one of those items accumulated along the way that had no obvious connection with Carmarthenshire, just showing how wrong one can be. In his writings he also gives a history of the family of Hoyos dating back to the beginning of the sixteenth century.

Alicemargit was the fourth child, and first daughter, of Count Edgar Hoyos and Countess Ilona (née Kinsky) born 26 February 1907. However, it is not the Hoyos family but Count Edgar's mother, Alice Whitehead, daughter of Robert Whitehead, engineer and the inventor of the self-propelled torpedo, that provides the connection. Robert developed the torpedo after being approached by the Austrian government to produce a weapon to destroy ships from a distance. At the time he had been working in a warship factory in Fiume, then part of the Austria-Hungary empire. Alice Whitehead's brother, John, married Agathe Breunner, their eldest daughter, Agathy (Alicemargit's second cousin once removed), provides the final link, Count Edgar writes of Agathy's future husband:

'We soon made friends with him and he was often a guest in our house, but still oftener at Aunt Agathe Whiteheads whose eldest daughter Agathy, then a charming and pretty girl of 18 he was particularly interested in. He always said he had fallen in love with her, when she had smashed the Champagne bottle on the bows of his Submarine, during the launching Ceremony.'

The submarine commander was of course, Georg Ritter von Trapp. Agathy died in 1922 from scarlet fever, Georg remarried and it could be said that the rest is cinematic history.¹²
